

The RAD and GDPR

On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into effect. The new rules will mean more rights and protections for you and how your personal information is held and used.

Like any organisation which collects personal data, the RAD has been busy preparing for the new legislation. You may have noticed recently that you are being emailed by lots of companies asking you if you want to stay on their mailing lists. Among these may have been a message from the RAD as part of our preparation for GDPR and to ensure that you want to remain in contact with us, particularly if you are not a student or member of the RAD.

What does this mean for our members and customers?

Until now, your information has been protected under the 1995 Data Protection Directive – introduced at a time before so much data was being shared online. Now, GDPR will give you more control over what happens to your information in the digital age, arming you with the right to see what personal data of yours is being held by companies, to withhold consent for its use, and, if necessary, to ask for it to be deleted. All companies working in the EU must comply with the new regulation – including those in the UK post-Brexit, as it has now been written into UK law.
