ABOUT ISOBEL ANDERSON



Isobel Anderson FRAD

Isobel Anderson's early ballet training was at the Osborn School of Dance in Sydney before she commenced her RAD training at age 18 at the Frances Scully School of Dancing. In 1935 she sat all her student examinations in the Academy's first Australian examination tour and in 1939 she achieved her RAD Advanced Teacher's Diploma.

Isobel's dance performances include a charity matinee at Sydney's Theatre Royal in December 1939 where she danced a principal role with Tamara Tchinorova, Valentin Zeglovsky and Audrae Swayne in a performance of Les Sylphides staged by Helene Kirsova, who had danced with Col. De Basil's Ballet Russe. Isobel went on to teach at the Frances Scully School before opening her own ballet school from 1946 until 1967.

Appointed an RAD Children's examiner in 1952 and RAD Life Member in 1980, Isobel was an examiner, tutor and mentor to students and teachers alike. She chaired the RAD NSW Regional Advisory Panel for 25 years and was appointed as its Patron. She was awarded a Fellowship of the Royal Academy of Dance in 1986, and in 1987 in her honour, the Isobel Anderson Awards began.

"Students need to listen to and hear the music, let it become part of them because the art of being creative is so important to a dancer. The intention of these Enchaînements is to give the dancer an opportunity to interpret the music as they feel it. It is not to be viewed as a syllabus for examination."

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FORMAT

Preliminary & Semi-Final Classes

- All candidates will attend a Preliminary Class.
- Preliminary and semi-final classes for Intermediate Foundation and Intermediate will be examination syllabus with free enchainements included as per the guidelines provided.
- Where pointe work is included, examination syllabus exercises should be used for INT and ADVF. No pointe will be included for INTF.
- Preliminary and semi-final classes for ADVF and ADVI will be open class work consisting of steps from the RAD syllabi.
- Pointe work exercises for ADVI may include syllabus or open work.
- Audiences will be permitted in all Preliminary and Semi-final rounds. Tickets are limited, with no additional tickets available once they have been sold out. Tickets will be made available via TryBooking (once entries have closed and classes have been assigned).
- Preliminary class times will be sent to the candidates nominated contact once entries have closed. Please allow the whole day/s to attend the Awards, as candidates are not able to request specific classes/times.

Finals

Finalists will perform the following:

- Isobel Anderson port de bras performed in small groups.
- RAD syllabus variation candidates choice, performed as a solo.
- Commissioned choreography piece performed as a solo.
- Entrance tableau performed in each grade, this will not be adjudicated.

Isobel Anderson Port de Bras

- The Isobel Anderson female/male port de bras: the integrity of Miss Anderson's choreography for the port de bras must not be changed.
- The port de bras can be found in the Members' Area of our website (at the bottom of the Australian Teacher Resources page). It is the responsibility of teachers to ensure that candidates entering the Awards are prepared to perform the Isobel Anderson Port de Bras as set.
- No costumes are required; please see the Dress Code below.
- Finalists are advised to leave the entire day of the Finals free. Times for stage rehearsals on the day of the finals will be confirmed prior to the day.
- Teachers and parents are NOT permitted to enter the auditorium or stage area at any time during the rehearsals.
- Only authorised staff, volunteers and finalists are permitted backstage.

NOTE: RAD Australia reserves the right to adjust the format of preliminaries, semi-finals and finals depending on venue and other requirements. Confirmation of format and any adjustments will be provided to finalists prior to the event.

COMMISSIONED CHOREOGRAPHY WORKSHOP

Commissioned Choreography

All finalists will participate in a Commissioned Choreography Workshop. During this 1.5 hour workshop, finalists will learn a commissioned choreography piece in a neo-classical or lyrical/contemporary style. The piece will be approximately 1.5 minutes in length.

A link for both Commissioned Choreography pieces will be sent to each finalist no later than COB Monday, 31st March as a memory prompt for the rehearsal process.

DRESS CODE

Preliminaries & Semi-Finals

Candidates performing Female Syllabus:

- Classical leotard in one block colour only (no patterns/multiple colours). No school leotards, halter necks, cap sleeves, jazz styles.
- Leotard must be suitable to affix candidate number to front and back.
- Candidates may choose ballet tights that match their skin tone.
- Soft ballet shoes in satin, canvas or leather with matching elastic or ribbons. Split sole shoes are permitted. Candidates may choose shoes that match their skin tone. Intermediate, Advanced Foundation and Advanced 1 candidates require flats and pointe shoes for their semi-finals classes.
- Light make-up may be worn.
- Appropriate hair ribbon or decoration is also permitted.

Candidates performing Male Syllabus:

- Candidates may wear either long tights and fitted top (sleeveless optional) or a unitard (black or navy blue).
- Socks and ballet shoes (colour optional).

Finals

Candidates performing Female Syllabus:

- As per Preliminary & Semi-Final Classes (above).
- Half tutu or chiffon skirt may be worn for the syllabus classical variation.
- Performance make-up and appropriate hair decoration to be worn.
- For the Commissioned Choreography piece only, candidates may wear bare feet, foot thongs or canvas ballet shoes. It is recommended they wear convertible ballet tights. Wearing socks alone is not permitted due to safety reasons.

Candidates performing Male Syllabus:

- As per Preliminary and Semi-Final Classes (above).
- Performance make-up.
- For the Commissioned Choreography piece only, candidates may wear bare feet, foot thongs or canvas ballet shoes. Wearing socks alone is not permitted due to safety reasons.

Candidates are required to wear shoes and appropriate clothing when not in class and when arriving and departing from the venue. All candidates should arrive for all classes and performances dressed and ready to dance (warm-ups over dancewear), with makeup and hair done. All candidates should bring their own water bottles, snacks, and towels; as well as individual props (if required for their dance). Due to allergies, we request that snacks with nuts are not brought to the venues.

Please ensure candidates arrive no earlier than I hour prior to their class time for preliminary and semi-finals rounds.

ADDITIONAL

T-shirts

Candidates receive an event t-shirt as part of their entry. Due to product lead times, no changes can be made to t-shirt size after an entry has been submitted; exchanges for a different size will not be available; and late entries will not receive a t-shirt.

Entry Fees and TryBooking Information

- Entry fee \$117.50 per candidate which includes an event t-shirt.
- A credit card is needed to book via TryBooking. There may be booking fees and charges in addition to the entry fee for each student entered.

Booking Multiple Entries via TryBooking

- More than one candidate can be booked at the same time and one payment can be made.

- Candidates must be studying the Royal Academy of Dance (RAD) Syllabus, be residing in the state in which the Awards will be held and must be enrolled with an RAD Registered Teacher in that state at the time of entry and at the time of the Awards.
- Candidates must be of non-professional status, meaning they are not engaged by a professional company or production on a regular basis as a paid dancer.
- Candidates are eligible to enter the Awards for the exam level they entered and passed in the 2024 Exam session.
- If a student has entered two Vocational examinations in the 2024 RAV or AEC Examination Session, they must enter the Awards at the higher of the two levels.
- If a student is sitting both a Grade AND a Vocational examination in the 2024 RAV or AEC Examination Session, they are eligible to enter in both sections.
- Students must be in uniform as per this flyer. Those who do not comply may be disqualified from the event.
- Students must participate in all relevant aspects of the awards for their entered level to avoid disqualification.
- The adjudicators' decision is final and no communication regarding their decision will be entered into.
- Some physical contact may be necessary by a member of the faculty to demonstrate exercises during classes or if a member of the staff needs to administer first aid.
