STUDYING WITH AN RAD REGISTERED TEACHER

To enter for RAD exams, students must study with an RAD Registered Teacher.

You can find a local teacher on our website. All of our teachers are trained to the highest standards, must follow our Code of Conduct, and are subject to an Enhanced Disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS), or overseas equivalent.

WORLD LEADERS IN DANCE EXAMS

We are committed to equality of access through our stringent quality assurance procedures so that our exam and assessment processes are accountable, transparent, and consistent. At the RAD, we have a large panel of examiners in over 25 countries, who all undergo a rigorous training and standardisation programme. This means that each student is judged fairly against a set of specific criteria based on the learning outcomes of that exam level

Our Graded exams, Solo Performance Awards, Vocational exams and Discovering Repertoire qualifications are all accredited by the UK regulators, Ofqual, Qualification Wales, SQA Accreditation and CCEA, and feature on the UK qualification frameworks (QCF, CQFW, SCQF).



In addition, our exams at Level 3 are allocated points on the UCAS tariff (the UK's university admissions system). This means that candidates can use their RAD exam result to earn UCAS points when applying for courses at universities or higher education in the UK. These are also widely recognised internationally.



EXAM OPTIONS FOR EVERYONE

We offer many different exam options and assessments to provide a varied choice for students.

Graded Exams – Primary to Grade 8

Students perform three different dance components allowing a demonstration of multiple skills. All students who are successful at RAD exams receive a security enhanced certificate and a medal.

Solo Performance Awards – Grade 1-7

Students perform three solo pieces in the exam and have the opportunity to bring in different dance genres and choreography.

Vocational Graded Syllabus – Intermediate Foundation – Solo Seal

With a heavy emphasis on technique, these exams are designed for students who want to study classical ballet in greater depth.

Discovering Repertoire – Level 2-4

A qualification split into three units which students can take over a period of time. Units 1 and 2 are



focused on individual performance, and unit 3 being presented as a class.

Some of the RAD syllabus is presented in the traditionally classical male or female roles though students can choose which syllabus they perform, regardless of the sex assigned at birth, or the gender with which they identify.

For those with additional needs, we have a clear process and policy for applying reasonable adjustments, allowing all students to perform to the best of their ability on their exam day.





UNACCREDITED ASSESSMENTS

Assessed in a class contest, our unaccredited assessments are designed to be more inclusive and adaptable to candidates with diverse learning needs. These assessments can be tailored to accommodate different learning styles and needs providing valuable practice for future exams. The assessment is intended to give a broad overview of the candidate's achievement and progress.

Demonstration classes

Based on our pre-school dance curriculum, Dance to your Own Tune, demonstration classes involve a short performance from each student who then receives a certificate of participation as a mark of their personal achievement



Class Awards – Pre-Primary to Grade 8

Students perform a selection of exercises and one dance. The assessment criteria are holistic, and, except for Grade 8, the exam is run by the teacher while the examiner observes. Students receive formal certificates in recognition of their achievement.
